What are the options?

What are the options?

- PEG (KleenPrep)
 - Macrogel 3350 (osmotic laxative)
 - Sodium sulphate, bicarbonate, chloride
 - Potassium chloride

Sodium phosphate (Coloprep)

What are the options?

- Moviprep
 - Macrogel 3350
 - Sodium sulfate, chloride, ascorbate
 - Potassium chloride
 - Ascorbic acid

- Picoprep
 - Sodium picosulfate, magnesium, citrate

Splitting the preparation

- Split dose is best whether PEG or NaP
- Bowel preparation should be given in split doses (half of the dose is given on the day of procedure)

Why?

- Faecal clearing achieved either way
- But
 - Intestinal secretions
 - Chyme
 - Mucus

Particularly in right side of colon

When?

- 2nd completed 3 hours before colonoscopy
- Smallest interval 2 hours (ASA sedation guidelines)
- Longest 6-8 hours

Adverse Events

NaP

- Toxic effects are mediated by systemic absorption of phosphate in excess of patients renal clearance capacity
- Acute electrolyte disturbance
- Hypocalcaemia (sequestration of calcium to mop up phosphate)
- Acute phosphate nephropathy
- Renal failure requiring dialysis

Adverse Events

- Patients at risk of electrolyte disorder/renal injury
 - Existing renal dysfunction
 - Hypertensive
 - ACE inhibitors
 - Angiotensin receptor blockers
 - NSAIDS

Diet

Clear liquid diet the whole day before

Light breakfast then clear liquid diet

- Split preparation
- PEG based safest
- Watch out for specific groups
